<u>Agenda Item E – Evaluation Report: Application from ATU for accreditation of a Five-Year</u>

<u>Fully Integrated Master's Degree Programme in Pharmacy\*</u>

#### Issue

Evaluation Report: Application from ATU for accreditation of a Five-Year Fully Integrated Master's Degree Programme in Pharmacy\*

#### Information

The Committee considered the evaluation report on the outcome of a first-time application for accreditation of a five—year fully integrated Master of Pharmacy (MPharm) programme developed by the new Department of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences at Atlantic Technological University (ATU), Sligo. The Committee discussed the recommendation of the accreditation team, which recommends that Council grant recognition and approval for the proposed MPharm for a period of five years, subject to specified conditions being met.

The Committee considered and discussed the evaluation report and the response by ATU. The Committee discussed at length the recommendation made by the accreditation panel concerning the proposed programme start date and the feasibility of achieving this ambition by ATU. The Committee expressed concern that ATU is proceeding with student intake in September despite the Accreditation Panel's recommendation that consideration be given by ATU to the benefits of postponing the start date of the MPharm programme, either to later in Semester 1 in the 2025/26 academic year or to the 2026/27 academic year. During its deliberations, the Committee

was informed that ATU has been actively preparing for the programme's commencement since late 2024 and has a well-considered induction process planned for new students. The Committee was also advised that at both the reconvened accreditation visit in July and in its response to the report of the accreditation team, ATU provided assurance that all necessary arrangements were in place to commence the programme in September 2025. The Committee was advised that this matter, along with the other recommendations and conditions for recognition and approval, would be reviewed during the compliance visit scheduled in the second year of the programme. It was noted that ATU had met the accreditation standards, and the panel's overall recommendation of recognition and approval was not contingent on compliance with this specific recommendation. The Committee also noted that the compliance visit, forming part of the ongoing oversight process, is expected to take place in the first semester of year two.

The Committee, following discussion, agreed to recommend to Council at its meeting on Monday, 25 August, the approval of the recognition of the MPharm Programme at Atlantic Technological University (ATU), subject to the conditions in the assessment report
